


## El Helicoide: From Mall to Prison May 9—July 13, 2017

Built in Caracas in the late 1950s, El Helicoide de la Roca Tarpeya, a state-of-the-art, drive-in mall, was never completed and went through decades of abandonment, failed projects, and informal occupations before Venezuelan security police took it over in 1985. A modern ruin, this futuristic building epitomizes modernity's utopic dreams and its dystopian reality, ultimately presenting the dark side of modernity in Latin America.

Terreform/Urban Research will launch the publication of *From Mall to Prison: El Helicoide's Downward Spiral* in conjunction with the exhibition. Edited by exhibition curator Celeste Olalquiaga and Lisa Blackmore, the book is a profusely-illustrated history and analytical commentary on El Helicoide.
