

This title illustrates the complexity of a South American city founded in 1567 which forges a coherent identity with El Ávila and the coastline, where different scales, geographies, architectural styles and natural and urban landscapes converge. This guide outlines the city's history with reference to its most striking architecture dating from approximately 1600 up to the present day. Architecture and urban spaces found in ten zones throughout Caracas are delineated, as well as conceptions held by urban planning experts regarding future initiatives that could transform and enhance the city.



QR CODES IN THIS BOOK AND THEIR USE

In the upper area of every project description you will find a so called QR code. This code contains geodata that can be read out with a scanner. Many recent mobile phones support these codes and are able to scan them. All QR codes have been created to work best with Apple iPhone 4 or subsequent models. For the iPhone we recommend the app "Scan" from QR Code City.

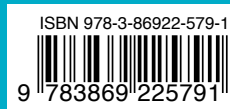
1. Scan QR code

Start the app "Scan", hold your iPhone at a distance of about 10 cm from your book and wait a minute for the QR code to come into focus. After the successful scan you will be routed to Google Maps and you will be able to see the position of the scanned project on the map.

2. Get directions

To get directions from your current location, tip the arrow top right and choose "Get directions". Now you have the opportunity to use your current location or another location as starting point for the calculation.

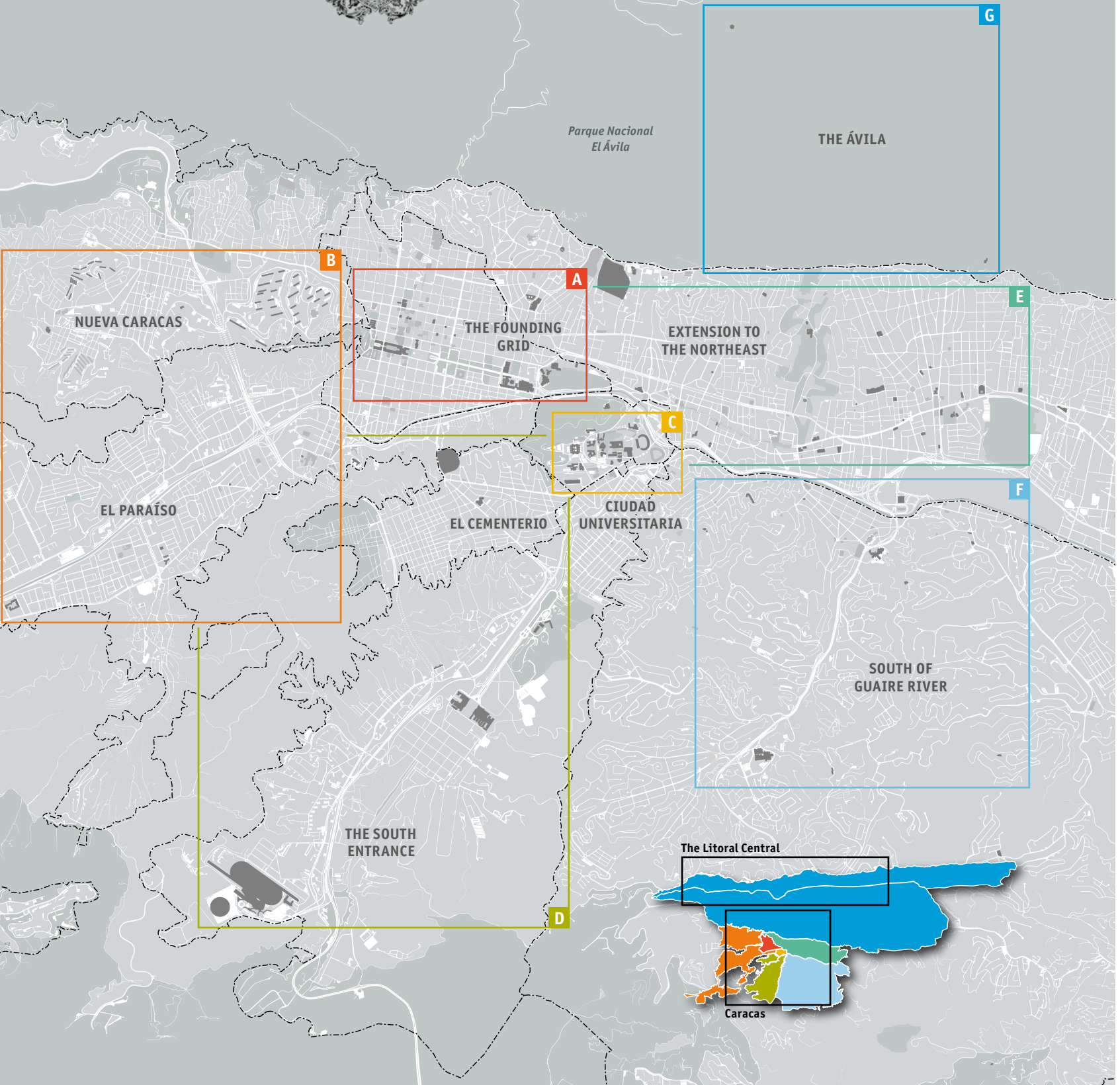
