Post-Professional Grants

Arnold W. Brunner Grant

Award \$15,000

Deadline February 1

Purpose Designed for mid-level architects to pursue architectural investigations that effectively contribute to the knowledge, teaching, or practice of the art and science of architecture. Proposed investigations must engage in contemporary architectural issues within local and global contexts and should result in a final written work, design project, research paper, or other form of presentation.

Eligibility Applicants must be US citizens in the profession of architecture or a related field and must have received their first professional degree at least five years prior to the application deadline.

Stewardson Keefe Lebrun Travel Grant

Award \$15,000

Deadline November 1

Purpose Founded to further the architectural education and professional development of early or mid-level career architects through travel. Proposed travel plans should focus on a selected topic of interest to the individual rather than as part of a larger humanitarian or institutional endeavor.

Eligibility Applicants must be US citizens with a professional degree in architecture, as well as practicing architects, either licensed or unlicensed. Academics are eligible as long as they are practicing architects as well.

Student Scholarships and Awards

Center for Architecture Design Scholarship

Award Multiple awards of up to \$5,000

Deadline March 15

Purpose Merit-based scholarship for students studying architecture, interior design, engineering, planning, or a related design discipline with demonstrated financial need.

Eligibility Students seeking their first degree in a design discipline from an accredited school in New York State are eligible. The dean or chair of the program may nominate two students to apply. Nominated students must have a high level of academic performance and evidence of financial need. US citizenship is not required.

Note Graduate students are eligible if completing their first professional degree.

Eleanor Allwork Scholarship

Award Multiple awards of up to \$7,500

Deadline March 15

Purpose Merit-based scholarship for architecture students with demonstrated financial need.

Eligibility Students seeking their first degree in architecture from a NAAB-accredited school in the State of New York are eligible. The dean or chair of the architectural school may nominate two students to apply. Nominated students must have a high level of academic performance and evidence of financial need. US citizenship is not required.

Note Graduate students are eligible if completing their first architectural degree.

Douglas Haskell Award for Student Journals

Award \$2,000

Deadline May 1

Purpose Founded to encourage student journalism on architecture, planning, and related subjects and to foster regard for intelligent criticism among future professionals. The award is intended to support the ongoing publication of student edited journals whose subject matter includes architectural design, history, and theory.

Eligibility Any student-edited journal (online or print) published by a school of architecture, landscape architecture, or planning in the United States is eligible. The publication must have been produced within two years prior to the date of application.

Walter A. Hunt, Jr. Scholarship

Award \$20,000

Deadline May 15

Purpose To promote and encourage the study of architecture by New York City public high school students through a two-year scholarship to supplement tuition and related costs during their freshman and sophomore years at architecture school.

Eligibility Applicants must be current New York City public high school seniors who have been accepted to a five-year Bachelor of Architecture program at a NAAB-accredited school of architecture in the US. NYC charter schools are eligible. Students at private, parochial, or other schools where tuition is charged are not eligible. US citizenship is not required.

Note Applicants must be New York City high school students.
