INTRODUCTION

Interiors are such an integral part of one's living, playing and working experience that the design of an interior space has gone beyond solely aesthetics or function. It is also about crafting a space for occupant comfort and well-being. How a space makes one feel and the impact on one's health has become as important as how a space looks and functions.

The inaugural BCI Asia Interior Design Awards seeks to recognise great interior architectural designs that stand out aesthetically, functionally and ergonomically.

This competition is a tremendous opportunity for both emerging and experienced architects and designers to showcase their creative ideas and promote excellence in designing outstanding interior spaces. The competition is also a chance for designers to generate awareness towards responsible designs (human, economic, environmental, ethical) and the importance of good design in our society.

This competition is open to licensed architects and professional interior designers and design consultants in their jurisdiction worldwide.

Concept stage: To be completed on or before 31 December 2017

Or

Completed: 1 January 2015 to 31 December 2017

The projects should be based in: Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia & Philippines.

JURY

JUDGING

The jury is composed of both academic and professional experts worldwide. In addition, the BCI Interior Design Awards will feature a focus group committee composed of ordinary people to normalise the scoring by eliminating bias solely on aesthetics or form. The votes of the jury will be weighted to determine the final results.

One winning design per category per country will be chosen by the jury and focus group committee.

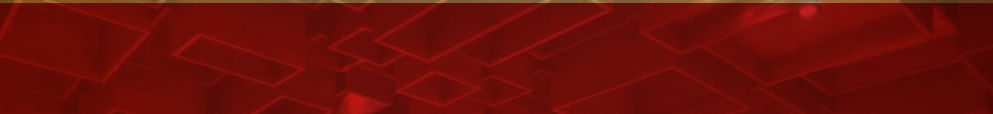
Projects can be entered in the following 4 categories:

1. Hotels: All types hotels, resorts, motels
2. Office: Commercial offices and public offices
3. Retail: Shops, showrooms, studios, clubs, restaurants, shopping malls, cafes, canteens, supermarkets
4. Residential: Condominiums, private houses, bungalows, villas

This means there will be 1 winner for Hotel category; 1 winner for Office category; 1 winner for Retail category; and 1 winner for Residential category from each country.

PRIZE

Winners will be honoured during the BCI Asia Awards night, a gala event that attracts the crème de la crème of the architecture, building and construction industry in all 7 BCI Asia countries. The total turn-out estimates over 2,500.

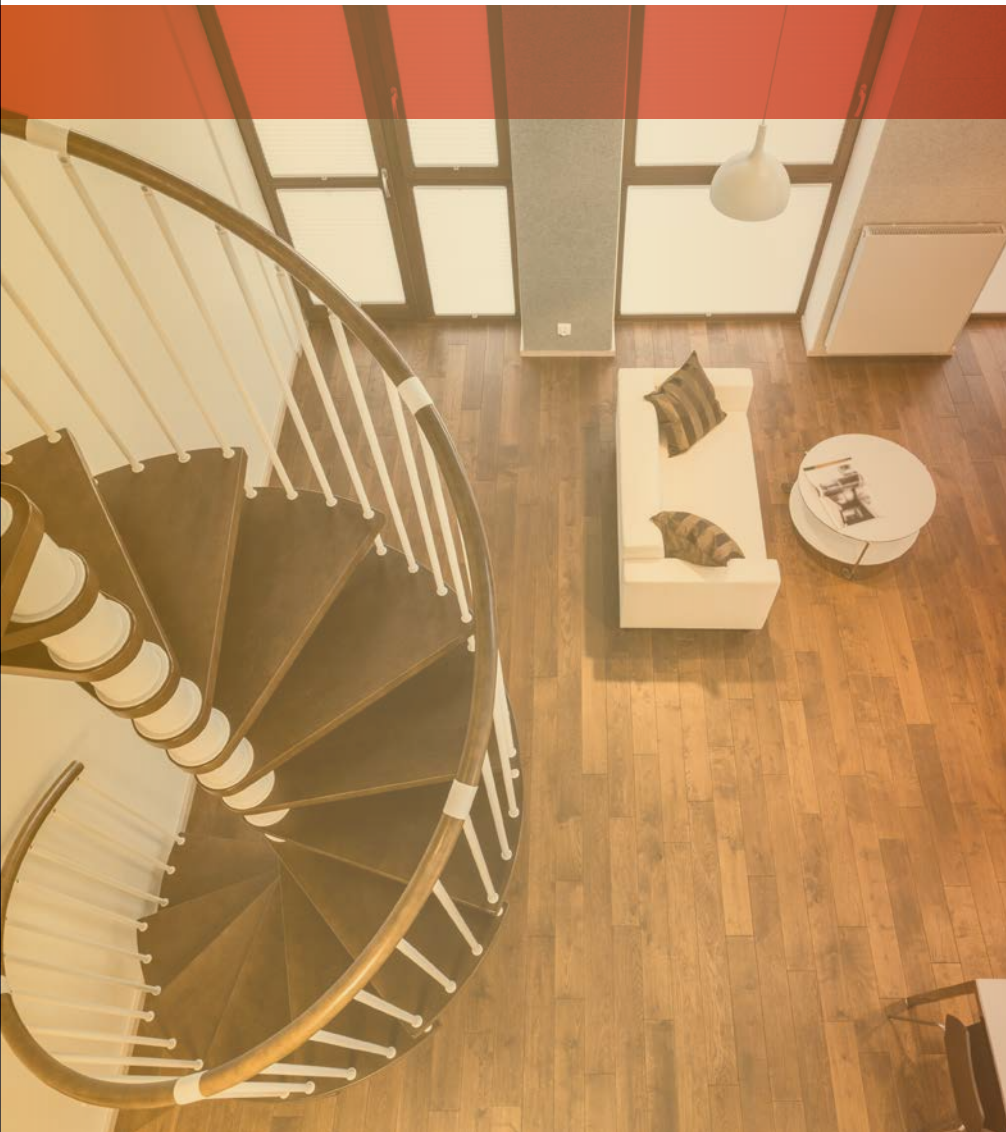
Winners and their winning projects will appear in BCI Asia's highly reputable titles FuturArc and Construction+ as well as websites and social media channels. FuturArc is the established leading voice of Green architecture and design in Asia, widely distributed in the region. Construction+ is a well-read magazine that reaches out to all industry professionals in Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia and Singapore.

Winners and their winning designs will receive coverage in major local newspapers/trade media.

EVALUATION

The best designs are selected according to the following equally weighted (20% each) criteria:

1. Spatial design: space usage, user friendliness and functional aspects
2. Comfort: ergonomics, emotional aspects and well-being
3. Aesthetics: appearance of the space
4. Innovation: the use of technology or creative ideas and environmental considerations
5. Realisation efficiency: practicality and ease of actualisation



REGISTRATION & SUBMISSION

To enter, prepare and submit:

- Firm's contact information including name, address, phone number, and email.
- Project's information including name and location.
- A 250-word max description of the project challenges, and a 250-word max description of specific solutions to project challenges.
- 7 to 10 colour images (jpg or jpeg under 1MB each) of your project – only one (1) exterior image permitted.

Entrants can participate as individuals or in teams.

All submissions must be sent in electronic format via **www.bciasiaidawards.com** or **idawards@bciasia.com** OR in hard copy/CD to nearest BCI office before 15 November 2016.

There is no limit to the number of eligible projects a firm may submit; however, each project may only be submitted once.
