Pasadena Overview Bus Tour Repeated on Monday.

This tour highlights the wide variety of architectural styles found in Pasadena, from the Victorian through the Modern era. Guests will see Pasadena’s Civic Center, Old Pasadena, the historic Arroyo Terrace Neighborhood, and the Arroyo Seco with its landmark Rose Bowl stadium. We will also visit other historic residential neighborhoods, drive past the Pasadena Playhouse, and glimpse two hotels that remain from Pasadena’s days as a grand resort location.

“From Victorian to Modern” explores Pasadena’s original downtown which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as it has transformed over the years from its Victorian roots, through its years of deterioration, and back to being an example of downtown restoration for the entire country as one of Pasadena Heritage’s first preservation success stories. After the tour, stay in Old Pasadena for drinks or dinner on your own.

**Neighborhood Tours - “The Off Ramp”

Development of the 210 freeway changed the residential landscape of Pasadena, but if one looks closely, remnants of our bungalow past are still present and are explored on this tour.

**Neighborhood Tours - Tournament Fields

Explore portions of Tournament Fields Historic District and homes from St. Francis Court, the very first bungalow court. This tour includes a particular emphasis on the early Craftsman style of architect Sylvanus Marston.

The historic Orange Heights neighborhood, listed on the National Register in 1995, includes 85 contributing homes.
